

HISTORY (CHIS)

CHIS 201 United States, Africa & World 3 Credits

These courses investigate the interactions between various continental peoples of Africa, Asia, Europe, and the Americas. The first semester examines events, perspectives, experiences and ideologies up to 1500. This course critically analyzes the social, economic, political, and geographical theories that have shaped global society.

CHIS 201H Honors Africa & World History 3 Credits

A one-year thematic course which provides an opportunity to analyze historical methodology and theories from a global perspective in relationship to social, economic, political and geographic factors. The past is examined in regard to understanding the present and predicting future events. Focus is on interaction between the continental peoples of Africa, North and South America, Asia and Europe. Satisfies General Education core requirement in history.

CHIS 201WS USA, Africa & World (WISE) 3 Credits

These courses investigate the interactions between various continental peoples of Africa, Asia, Europe, and the Americas. HIS 201 examines events, perspectives, experiences and ideologies up to 1500. HIS 202 continues the investigation to the present. These courses critically analyze the social, economic, political, and geographical theories that have shaped global society.

CHIS 202 United States, Africa & World 3 Credits

These courses investigate the interactions between various continental peoples of Africa, Asia, Europe, and the Americas. The second semester continues the investigation to the present. This course critically analyzes the social, economic, political, and geographical theories that have shaped global society.

CHIS 202H US Africa & World Honors 3 Credits

A one-year thematic course which provides an opportunity to analyze historical methodology and theories from a global perspective in relationship to social, economic, political and geographic factors. The past is examined in regard to understanding the present and predicting future events. Focus is on interaction between the continental peoples of Africa, North and South America, Asia and Europe. Satisfies General Education core requirement in history.

CHIS 202WS US, Africa & World (WISE) 3 Credits

These courses investigate the interactions between various continental peoples of Africa, Asia, Europe, and the Americas. HIS 201 examines events, perspectives, experiences and ideologies up to 1500. HIS 202 continues the investigation to the present. These courses critically analyze the social, economic, political, and geographical theories that have shaped global society.

CHIS 211 History of the United States 3 Credits

This course covers the social, political, and economic development of American life with special emphasis on the development of American nationality. The first semester covers the period from 1492 to 1865.

CHIS 212 History of the United States 3 Credits

This course covers the social, political, and economic development of American life with special emphasis on the development of American nationality. The second semester covers the period from 1865 to the present.

CHIS 319 African Amer History to 1865 3 Credits

Critical analysis of the experiences of African-Americans from their African societies, enslavement and transportation to America, up to 1877. The course includes the development of North American racism, the experiences of slavery, sectionalism, the Civil War, and Reconstruction.

CHIS 320 African Amer Hist Since 1865 3 Credits

Critical analysis of the experiences of African Americans from the Post-Reconstruction period to the present. Major topics include segregation, urban life, the Civil Rights Movement, and black contributions to American culture and society.

CHIS 350 History of Africa to 1800 3 Credits

An historical survey of pre-colonial African societies, from earliest times to 1800, emphasizing geography, sociocultural institutions, and politics.

CHIS 351 History of Africa Since 1800 3 Credits

An historical survey of Africa from the 19th century to the present with special emphasis on colonialism, growth of African nationalism, neo-colonialism, and contemporary issues of African nations amid globalization.

CHIS 355 US in the 20th Century 3 Credits

An historical analysis of the growth of the United States as a world power in the twentieth century. It emphasizes economic, political, and social aspects of the American experience.

CHIS 360 Amer Social & Intellectual His 3 Credits

A study of the effect that ideas and intellectual currents have on social life in modern America. Evaluation of thinkers of America's recent past and their impact on the daily life of the country.

CHIS 403 Historical Methods 3 Credits

A study of the sources utilized by historians in their attempts to re-create the past. Research papers are required.

CHIS 404 Early Modern Europe:1500-1815 3 Credits

Analysis of factors that produced modern European civilization. Topics include the Renaissance, the Reformation, the scientific revolution, the Enlightenment, and the rise of nationalism.

CHIS 405 Modern Europe Since 1815 3 Credits

A study of the social and political upheavals of the nineteenth century in Europe. Covers industrialization, nationalism, democracy, and the mass movements represented by socialism and fascism.

CHIS 422 History of Georgia 3 Credits

A survey of the history of Georgia from colonial times to the present. of particular significance to prospective teachers in elementary and secondary education.

CHIS 433 History of Urban America 3 Credits

Examines the development of modern urban institutions, focusing on community growth and organization, delivery of goods and services, governmental structure, and public policy.

CHIS 450 The Jim Crow South 3 Credits

An examination of racial segregation as practiced in the southern region of the United States from Reconstruction through the 1960s. Students will analyze historical readings and document oral accounts of African-Americans who experienced segregation.

CHIS 480 Independent Study 3 Credits

A program of reading, research, and writing in which students engage in a critical examination of one or more selected topics under the guidance of the instructor.

CHIS 490 Senior Seminar 3 Credits

A required research and writing course for seniors in which students utilize primary sources and complete a major paper integrating the various historical themes and interpretations introduced in earlier courses.

CHIS 491 Spec Topics in Contemp History 3 Credits

A study of the major forces and ideas as well as social, political and economic developments in contemporary history. Special thematic emphasis may vary from one semester to the next.

CHIS 551 U.S. Con. His.&Law Since 1877 3 Credits

Examines the history and legal structures of the United States from 1870 to the present.

CHIS 563 The Afr Amer in the US to 1877 3 Credits

Study of the social, economic, political and cultural development of African Americans during this period.

CHIS 564 Afr Amer in the US since 1877 3 Credits

Examines ideological trends, key personalities and events that have characterized the African American experience since Reconstruction.

CHIS 574 Post-Industrial America 3 Credits

Examination of the evolution of American society after World War II.

CHIS 575 Intell & Cultural Hist of US 3 Credits

Study of selected aspects of American thought and cultural development with attention to changing racial ideologies.

CHIS 576 Social & Eco History of the US 3 Credits

Survey of significant social and economic trends and problems with emphasis on the treatment of black people in urban centers.

CHIS 604 Sem Afr.Amer/Post Civil War 3 Credits

Research seminar on selected post-Civil War aspects of African-American development.

CHIS 605 Independent Study 1-3 Credits

Designed to give students under the supervision of the instructor an opportunity to pursue in-depth areas not covered in seminars or classes (offered on demand).

CHIS 606 Black Woman In Amer History 3 Credits

Research seminar analyzing the role of women in the historical development of the United States with emphasis upon black women.

CHIS 607 Community,Family&Oral History 3 Credits

Seminar emphasizing approaches to study and research in oral history using the community and family as points of entry.

CHIS 610 Selected Topics in Euro Hist. 3 Credits**CHIS 630 Historial Trends & Concepts: 3 Credits**

Analyses and syntheses of major trends and movements in the Western World since Ancient Times.

CHIS 631 Historical Trends: Third World 3 Credits**CHIS 676 History Internship 0 Credits****CHIS 680 History of Africa to 1800 3 Credits**

Saharan Africa before 1800 with emphasis on the diversity of ethnic groups and the changing nature of pre-colonial African societies.

CHIS 681 History of Africa Since 1800 3 Credits

Examines the social, political and economic development of Sub-Saharan Africa from 1850 to the present with special emphasis on a range of contemporary issues and themes.

CHIS 682 Seminar in African History 3 Credits

Explores in-depth selected aspects of African history from earliest times to the present.

CHIS 691 Thesis Consultation-MA 1 Credit**CHIS 695 Thesis Research-MA 1-3 Credits****CHIS 767 Modern Civil Rights Movement 3 Credits**

Examines the social contexts, underlying themes, personal motivations, shifting geographies, central groups, and widespread involvement in the move for African American social justice from the 1890s to the 1960s.

Explores the geographies of the African Diaspora, focusing on movement of peoples between and through continents from predating the African Slave Trade of the 1600 and 1700s to current migrations.

CHIS 780 History Internship 3 Credits

A variety of programs are available that provide a planned, supervised, and practical experience outside the classroom. Typically, students engage in research, museum, library, or archival work for a public agency or a private not-for-profit organization. Approval of the department chair is required for academic credit.

CHIS 781 History Internship 3-6 Credits

Approval of the department chair is required for academic credit.

CHIS 789 United History Post 1945 3 Credits

Course focusing on contemporary history of the United States. Brings study of African American social movements, economic and political trends and popular culture to the 21st Century.

CHIS 795 Advanced Historiography 3 Credits

Designed to train masters students in methods of research, thesis writing and historiography.
